About the College

The Lalit Chandra Bharali College was founded in 1971 as a night college by a group of teachers and operated from the premises of Maligaon Railway Higher Secondary School. At the initial stage it catered mostly to undergraduate working men and women. It was at the initiative of the neighbourhood community and the generous donation made by the family of Lalit Chandra Bharali that facilitated the purchase of its own land in 1972 and it was only from the next year that the college functioned for the first time from its own premises and since then it is the Governing Body that constitutes the primary management system of the college. The establishment of the college was driven by a holistic approach towards higher education to the marginal student community who could not access the central/city colleges for various reasons. It was also an educational outreach for the students who lived beyond the city limits and the entire Northeast. However, since the last two decades the college has notched up its credibility as it attracts some of the best students from the entire northeast region for its non-traditional subjects at the UG level.

The natural ambience of the college which is set for amidst the famous Nilachal hills gives a serene environment to students to pursue their studies.

Vision: To translate into a centre of excellence by foregrounding knowledge as empowerment and an instrument for inculcating social responsibility.

- To provide a centre of alternative career-oriented courses in Science, Technology and Management.

An Introduction to the Perspective Plan:

For the success of any institution a planned approach is very crucial. A plan document must highlight the priorities of the institution against the backdrop of the vision and mission of the institution. The College has undertaken the task of designing a Perspective Plan for the period of ten years commencing from academic year 2016-17 to academic year 2026-27 for a balanced growth. The quality indicators of different criteria determined by NAAC have been taken into consideration as the base to create Quality Radars and to make out milestones for the future. In the preparation of the Perspective Plan, inputs from all stakeholders viz, the management, the Principal, the faculty, the administrative staff, the students of the college, the parents are taken.
